Remembrance Day

Former Head Boy Michael Holloway (OS 90) returned to Stamford while visiting from New Zealand and joined OSA Chair Nicky Lambert to lay a wreath on Remembrance Day.

Years 7 - 11 gathered on Mainfields, along with staff and our guests, and fell silent at 11am as the Stamford community paid respects and remembered the lives lost.



Our Sixth Form and Junior School students also paid their respects at a service on their sites.

We were also delighted to welcome, for the first time, representatives from the Spalding Parachute Regiment and our Polish community to the main school service prior to their own memorial service at Brazenose House remembering those who fell in the war.

Chris Fox (OS 98, Staff 2004 - 10) has recently released his second book, *White Nile*, following on from 2022's *Dreams*.

Chris told us:

"After my first novel, *Dreams*, was published in 2022, I thought the time was right to begin writing another. Around that time, I had a vivid dream about walking the unfamiliar streets of Khartoum and, hey presto, the seed that became *White Nile* was planted.


Published by Blossom Spring Publishing, *White Nile* explores the effects of war on mental health and family life, while also serving as a thriller with fast-paced action, and all manner of twists and turns.

This book is a must for fans of thriller fiction, those who enjoy military and political stories, and people who like action-packed writing. I have already started writing the direct sequel to *White Nile*."

The blurb for the book is below:

"Captain James Hillsdon, an Iraq War veteran, is scarred by his tours of duty. Desperate for solace, he travels up the course of the River Nile in an act of soulsearching. When he reaches the city of Khartoum, Sudan, he makes a discovery that places him at the heart of a global crisis, and into the hands of two American officials.

But Hillsdon is hiding a secret, and the Americans know about it. If his secret is ever revealed, the consequences for Hillsdon's family will be unthinkable. He needs to make a choice, but if he chooses poorly, there will be no escaping the repercussions."







Keven Johnstone (Staff)

Jean Shields (OS 55, Staff 1961-1993)

We said our last goodbyes to Mrs Jean Shields on Tuesday 19 November at a service at Peterborough Crematorium in Marholm.

Leueen Burns from the Alumni Relations team attended as representative for the school, and joined attendees including Gladys Bland, SHS Head from 1978-1997. Other former members of staff also attended alongside Old Girls from various leaving years, and the touching service was conducted by Reverend Jo Saunders, herself an Old Stamfordian. Jo read a poignant tribute and it was a fitting send-off for a much-loved Old Girl and member of staff who influenced so many.

Chris Schofield (OS 60)

We received the news from Dudley Bryant that Chris Schofield passed away unexpectedly on Sunday 24 November 2024.

In his time at Stamford School Chris was a keen sportsman, representing both the school and Browne house in swimming and rugby. He is pictured below, back row centre, in the Browne Senior XV in 1958.



Later in life Chris became known as 'Mr Pinchbeck' due to his dedicated service to the village. He served as chairman of the Pinchbeck Carnival for 20 years and was also the chairman of Pinchbeck Village Hall. Chris was instrumental in many community initiatives, including the Pinchbeck Youth Club, Kids' Club, and a popular book stall that became a social gathering. He was often seen driving his tractor around the village, wearing his trademark hi-vis jacket and shorts.
