Stamford Shakespeare Company

Caroline Stephenson (nee Parker) (OS 83) has written to us about Stamford Shakespeare Company's 'Save Your Theatre' Campaign. Having attended the High School and spent many happy summers on school trips to Tolethorpe Hall (which started her love of Shakespeare), Caroline returned to the Stamford area when she had her children and joined Stamford Shakespeare Company. She started off acting in the Shakespeare plays, progressed to directing and is now Chair of the Board of Directors.



Due to Covid-19, the 2020 summer season of plays was postponed and this had a significant impact financially on the company, and Caroline has written to ask us to highlight the plight of

the company and request your help. The company is fundraising by setting up a Just Giving page and she is asking for help to save the theatre for future generations. The company recently received a grant from the Cultural Recovery Fund which will ensure they can keep going for now but the future is still so uncertain. It is probable that the audience next year will only be one third of capacity, due to social distancing requirements, which will make the plays financially unviable without help from fundraising.
