

Professor Margaret McGowan CBE (OS 49)

We were informed of the passing of Professor McGowan on 16 March at the age of 90.

Margaret was Head Girl and, after reading French at the University of Reading, became a dance historian and historian of early Modern France. She was appointed Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire in 1998 and in 2020, she was made a Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et Lettre.

Vix joined the Upper Thirds aged 11 in 1984 and loved her time at SHS, within the walls of grey. She attended as a day girl until the sixth form, when she became a boarder in Park House. Vix threw herself into school opportunities with enthusiasm, both work and play. She loved sports and played in the hockey and netball teams and was also a school prefect. We have so many happy memories of school days and we were always laughing together and Vix always had a smile on her face.

Vix achieved her A Levels in Maths, Biology and Chemistry and after school went onto Newcastle University where she studied dentistry. After qualifying Vix followed her career as a dentist and worked in York near to where she lived with her husband, James, and two daughters, Katie and Molly. Vix adored her family and her girls, who she was so incredibly proud of. When we went away for trips in recent years Vix often was the first to call time on our weekends to get back to them. We are so glad that she did.

Vix was the most caring and kind soul one is ever likely to know, always wanting to know how our children and families were – in more recent years our trips away were exchanged for face time calls during Covid, catching up with the news. We had so many fabulous and memorable mini breaks together as a three over the last ten years: from spa breaks to the sights of Biarritz; from parasailing in Corfu to punting in Cambridge. Every activity obviously ended up with a nice G&T or so in a little bar somewhere!

We are thinking of all the family that Vix has left behind, especially James, Katie, Molly, and her parents, Cec and David and brother, Ed during this very difficult time.

Mrs Frieda Gosling

Lindy Carter (née Gosling) (OS 80) informed us of the passing of her mother, a long-serving member of staff at Stamford High School, Mrs Frieda Gosling.

Mrs Gosling taught for 35 years between 1969 - 1994, was a former Head of Geography, and also wrote 'Within These Walls Of Grey', a history of SHS which was published in 1997.



Upon sending out details of the funeral arrangements earlier this month, we received some lovely messages which we have passed on to Mrs Gosling's family, who were very appreciative of the memories.

"I am so sorry to hear this news.

Throughout my school years (1985-1992) I had such affection for Mrs Gosling, which only deepened the longer you knew her. She brought us on field trips to Norfolk messing about in sand dunes, to Boston to The Boston Stump and to study the different areas of town development, day trips to look at river development where we ended up going in for a swim!!! So many experiences that I will always cherish, and her enthusiasm was infectious. I have lovely photos of her on some of my those trips. I will look them out for this summer's reunion in June.

I went on to study Geography at Sheffield University, which was in no doubt down to her. I was so proud to tell her that on my next visit back to the school.

Please pass on my sincerest condolences to Frieda's family."

"Mrs Gosling, is probably one of the teachers I remember from school who really made an impact on my life.

I loved Geography! And, despite going on to History of art, my geography lessons are the ones that still help my life in my innate ability to guide myself through the world, anywhere - maps, topography, social geography - all.
