Second Novel for OS Author

Back in April of this year we wrote about Danielle Redding (OS o6), who published her first novel, *Spiritchild*. Our ER Intern, Caitlin Brown (OS 21), caught up with Danielle earlier this month to celebrate National Author's Day, held annually on November 1, to discuss her journey after Stamford and her upcoming second novel, *Earthchild*.

After leaving Stamford with fond memories in 2006, Danielle had the goal of becoming a vet.

"When I was a kid, I used to watch all of these tv shows with vets and I thought, that's what I want to do. It wasn't until I was in my final year at university, and we were doing placements, that I realised the job didn't fit with me, so that's when I started branching out and trying new things."

Danielle has always enjoyed writing, but when she committed to becoming a full-time writer, "it was quite scary because it was something that doesn't necessarily pay off straight away, they take a lot of effort to start seeing the rewards."



Reflecting on her time here at Stamford, Danielle recalled how her school experiences help her to write today; "the sport tours, the world expeditions, DofE – all these other things that you have the opportunity to do, are experiences that you draw from when you write." "One thing I find hilarious though", she added, "is I hated English, it was my least favourite subject, and I gave it up as soon as I could. Yet here I am. The biggest thing I would say to students, is what you choose to do at school does not necessarily shape your whole life. I did veterinary medicine, and I now write fantasy books."

Danielle's debut novel, Spiritchild, is an adult fantasy set in a natural world of lush forests populated by elves. It is available to purchase online, with stockists listed on Danielle's website.

Joyce Fray (née Butt) (OS 45)

We have been informed by Joyce's daughter, Helen, of Joyce's sad passing on 20 September 2022. Our thoughts go out to Joyce's family and friends.

Helen writes:

During the Blitz in 1941, her family was forced to relocate from London to a farmhouse near Uffington. She attended Stamford School for Girls from that point on and made many lifelong friends. She also met her future husband and life partner, Gordon (OS 47), whom she married in 1953.

Joyce trained as a teacher at Clapham and Streatham Hill Training College, and on completing her training, taught primary pupils at St. Nicholas School, Fleet, and then at St. Helen and St. Catherine, Abingdon.

Later, she and Gordon moved to Sandhurst where their children were born, moving to Portishead in 1963.

Returning to teaching, she worked briefly at Gordano School, and High Down in Portishead and St. Mary's Portbury, before joining the staff at the Downs Preparatory School, Wraxall. Here she specialized in helping children with their Maths and English on a small class basis, a job she loved.

Joyce was an enthusiastic gardener and took great pleasure working alongside her husband, Gordon, transforming their gardens into peaceful places to sit and enjoy nature. Together they made a wonderful team celebrating 69 years of marriage in August.

A funeral and celebration of her life was held on Tuesday 11 October at St. Peter's Church, Portishead.
