John Fox (OS 60) John Fox writes as follows:

In the OSC July Updates, Martin Vink recalls seeing someone wearing an OS baseball cap while he was on holiday in New Zealand; the wearer turned out to be the son of the late Mike Chew. I had a similar experience while serving in Malta with the RAF in 1957.

My wife and I were taking a leisurely Sunday afternoon stroll along the sea front in Sliema when having just passed a couple walking in the opposite direction, I heard a remark "That was an Old Stamfordian tie." All four of us stopped and turned and it transpired that the remark had come from Mr PJ Watson-Liddell, a master at the School during my time but never a pupil of his. We adjourned to the Watson-Liddell's nearby flat and spent a very pleasant couple of hours, or so, reminiscing over afternoon tea. As Martin said, always travel with an OS baseball cap. However, if you are my age an OS tie might be more appropriate!

After leaving Stamford School in 1954 Watson-Liddell "signed up" with the War Office and, at the time of our meeting, was on the staff of the Services

Secondary School on the Island. The Register of Stamford School 1532 to 1960 shows that in 1960, he was Headmaster of a similar School in Cyprus. John Fox (OS 60)

It was pleasant indeed to hear the Bishop, in the course of his sermon, refer to David's time at Stamford. The Church there is a real gem and the Rectory in which David will live has a magnificent sit on the

summit of the Lincoln Edge looking out west over the plain at the foot of the scarp.

My sincere condolences to John Riley's family. "Snod" as he was affectionately known, was my first form master in Upper II in 1954. As a rather shy eight year old in my first term at "big school," I was at first rather shy of this strict, but fair master. But I always remember him marching in one afternoon and declaring that there would be no lessons that afternoon, we would be listening on the radio to one of our own OS playing on the wing for Oxford in the annual Varsity Match against Cambridge. This was of course MJK Smith, who went on to become a double blue and a double international-at rugby and cricket. I credit "Snod" with giving me the enthusiasm for competitive sport and the motivation to do well. After all, if a Schoolboy at Stamford could achieve so much, why couldn't I? I will always be thankful to him and have been telling this true story for the last fifty years or more!
