NEWS OF INTERNATIONAL PLANS

Further to the mailing about future international travel plans for the Schools, we have had some questions from Old Stamfordians about our international activities, and we wanted to share with you some of the detail about our global links.



International students make up a third of all boarding students in the UK, and they contribute greatly to the diversity of our school and boarding communities. Stamford's international reputation is going from strength to strength, with dozens of families choosing to send their children to our Schools: in a typical year, just under a quarter of our

boarders choose to travel to us from overseas. Interest in Stamford has continued despite the global pandemic, which is a reflection of how highly these families value the quality of education and experiences available at Stamford. In total, 14 nationalities are represented within our boarding community.

International families typically choose an international school through one of two routes: by utilising the services of an agent who can recommend schools and assist with the application process, or by attending events where they can meet representatives from different schools and discuss how each may be a fit for their child. Our Principal, Will Phelan, and members of the International Admissions team, visit a small number of these events in various countries each year to meet with families and share what Stamford has to offer. This overseas travel is an excellent opportunity for us to host social events for our OS community without the expense of making a special trip, and events in the past have been extremely well-received by those living in these areas.

SECTOR GROUPS

In recent years, we have launched a Sector Group Programme through LinkedIn where groups of Old Stamfordians, from various industries/professions, are meeting for informal networking and to share ideas. REMINSCENCES

John Lewis (OS 54) writes the following:

So you went to Stamford? Well, briefly ...

John Lewis (now 85) was a difficult child and, it being wartime, father a POW and grandparents being far, far too lofty to help, I was packed off to Stamford School in 1943, aged just short of 7.

My interview was with Canon Day himself. He asked me to read a paragraph from a book picked at random off the shelf and the next weekend I was boarding. Initially I was

boarded with a charming couple named Carter whose life I soon complicated by catching chicken pox, a serious disease in those days.

Then 52 St Martin's was acquired under the Moores and odd children like me were herded into a rather attractive early Victorian house with a good garden. A much more serious regime followed, professional and suffering no nonsense. Still troublesome, I seemed to survive without untoward incident. St Martin's being the opposite side of Stamford, those boarders had to pack their bags for the day, walk to school across Stamford and walk back after school. Decades later, I like to believe my lifelong love of walking developed at that time and also, probably, my ability to organize myself.

Incidentally on the route between St Martins and school were distractions, including a small row of primitive cottages. This was probably our first contact with the squalor of the very poor and sadly for some of us it may have been our last contact. We also passed a small camp of Polish soldiers who always seemed to have time to wave and laugh. As all soldiers of that time — one morning they were not there, gone we supposed to embarkation ports on the south coast.

The build-up to D-day was such a vast operation that it was the forbidden talk of the country. At that time the Great North Road ran right through the centre of Stamford, along St Martins and we watched in high excitement. Convoy followed convoy of American vehicles which had landed at Liverpool, day and night, grinding and roaring up St Martins. Tanks, guns, unrecognisable structures for building bridges, for destroying mines, and canvas lorries without number with strange faces peering out of the back. Day after day. Far into the dark, as the sound of another convoy approached, strict bedtime discipline collapsed and we were all at the blacked out windows.

VE-day and VJ-day came at last. In due course I moved to one of the School houses. I think there are plenty of reminiscences of that period so I will skip a few years.

I left in 1954 and went into the Merchant Navy as an apprentice in a London-Greek tramp. A much more interesting education. In due course, by the New Zealand Shipping Company and Canadian Pacific, I took my Extra Masters Certificate. After being called to the Bar as a barrister (a mistaken turn) I worked in the City, running a mutual insurance association.

Finally I retired in my 50s and worked overseas, mostly in Eastern Europe and the Balkans setting up micro-credit groups for a charity. That was quite the most rewarding and interesting period in my rather muddled career. My last task was a summer in Gaza which drove my wife to confiscate my passport.

Alfred Leonard Vice (OS 39/40)


We were informed that Alfred passed away, aged 99, in June 2021. His funeral was held on 23 July 2021 at Trinity Methodist Church in Woking, and further information, as well as a fundraising page, <u>can be found here</u>.

Our Archivist writes:

During his schooldays, Alfred Leonard Vice was Prefect for Country House at Stamford School. In 1937, he was awarded Form Prizes (Upper IV) for English Subjects and English Language, followed by Upper V Form Prizes in English Subjects and French in 1938. He also won the Samuel Edwards Leaving Exhibition and a Kesteven Major Scholarship which covered the fees for him to attend Lincoln College, Oxford.

Revd Michael Savage (OS 52)

Michael's family have informed us that he sadly died in April 2021.







In his own words.....

"I had been studying Classics at Stamford School, but struggled with Greek, fluffing my "A" level, but was still accepted at St. Peter's Hall, Oxford to read Law (but I was told to go away and do National Service first!). As graduation approached, advice came from all sorts of directions, yet the answer that kept coming was the call to ministry in the church. Some friends were encouraging, while others counselled caution. The college chaplain suggested contacting the C.of E. Selection Board; and their secretary invited me for an exploratory chat in London, simply "with a view", and I found myself being recommended for training, which was more than I had expected!

"I was considering the need to change from reading Law to Theology, but I was anxious about my preliminary exams that first Easter (my school track record with exams had not been good!), and I feared I had spent too much time on the river with the College Boat Club. But these various hurdles were overcome, and what finally clinched the issue was a message of support from the Master if I were to change from Law to Theology.

"After graduation, the next leg of my journey took me to theological college in Bristol (Tyndale Hall, as it was then) now part of Trinity College. I had been invited to serve my

first curacy in Rugby (where I was to meet my future wife, Daphne). And so the Lord led me to down-town Bradford where we spent nearly seven years, which was followed by an extremely different parish in Ilkley. We spent our final years of ministry in a rural group of parishes in Norfolk, before retirement came in 1999. For retirement, we returned to our beloved Yorkshire Dales!"

His son, Andrew concludes:

"Dad died on 28th April 2021 after a short, but acute chest condition. We thank God for his life and legacy, which was forged by his faith and the challenges of daily life. Dad's biggest regret, was his demotion from Head Boy at Stamford! The story goes, there was a mock-General Election and he announced the results to the school before the Headmaster's approved hour. For this, Dad was stripped of his title... .. at least, this is the reason he gave us! Can a member of the OCS confirm or clarify these events?!"




