

Mike and his wife Ena used to come up to Easton on a Sunday to have afternoon tea with my parents, my father was head of Easton Primary School. We had laid a grass tennis court in the back garden and Mike and my father had some quite competitive games there. Mike's connection with my Dad was they both went to the same school in Oxford apart from their love for tennis.

Mike did a tremendous job with the Old Stamfordian magazine, and when we met up in Stamford some time ago, he had worked out that if he lived to 100 he would be around to celebrate the special occasion of the school's 500th year since its foundation - I hope I have that right! Both my wife and myself thought that he was in extremely good nick considering his age , and we were both very shocked to hear of his untimely death.

# FAREWELLS

We are sad to report the passing of three Old Stamfordians; Alan Luntley, Robert Burbidge and Graham Robinson.

Our sympathy goes out to the families and friends of all.

#### Alan Luntley (OS 54)

We were informed of Alan's passing by his wife Mavis who, alongside our Archivist, provided the following information.



Alan Luntley attended Bluecoat School before joining Stamford School in September 1947. He made the rank of Corporal in the Army Section of the Combined Cadet Forces and served as a House Prefect for Radcliffe House during his last year at Stamford School. He also won the House Colours for Swimming and sat on the Committee for the Chess Club. In Drama, Alan served as stage staff on Shakespeare's *Coriolanus* (1953) and played

a gentleman of the jury in *Trial by Jury* (1954).

After Stamford School, Alan went straight into National Service Training with the Royal Army Ordnance Corps. He spent most of his working life in the timber-using industry. In 1957, he became assistant manager at a Joinery Manufacturing Firm in Barking, Essex. By 1989, he was Managing Director for a major door company in Melton Mowbray. At the same time, he served as Vice-Chairman for the Old Stamfordian Club under former headmaster, H.A. Staveley (OS 1935) during the Club's centenary year. In 1989, he became OSC Chairman.

"Alan sees his year as Chairman as one of consolidation, strengthening the administrative and communication aspects of the Club. He views a growth of membership, both in those leaving school and those who have lost contact with us, as an important way in improving the status of the O.S. Club." -OSC Newsletter, September 1989

#### Robert Burbidge (OS 63)

We were informed of Robert's passing by John McKechnie (OS 66). Our Archivist has written an article about Robert which <u>you can read here</u>.

### Graham Robinson (OS 65)

Graham William Robinson attended Glinton Church of England School before he joined Stamford School in September 1955. He was first in Cecil House, and then moved over to Exeter House in 1960. Graham was a House Prefect, a Sergeant in the CCF, Biology Librarian, and won the House Colours for Athletics.

During the 1960s, Graham joined the School Tennis Team. In 1963, he represented the School at the Boys' School L.T.A. championships at Wimbledon. He was Captain of the Tennis Teams for both Exeter House and Stamford School. In the photograph of the School Team from 1964, Graham is seated centre in the front row.
