We are sad to report the passing of Michael Kee, Alan Field, Graham Robinson and Chris Acum. Our sympathy goes out to the families and friends of all.

#### Michael Kee (OS 62)



Michael was at Stamford School from 1955-62. He was in St Paul's House during his first year, and then moved across to Radcliffe in 1956. He was CQMS in the CCF, School Prefect, and Editor of the Stamfordian. We have a picture of him as a schoolboy – from the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Cricket Team, 1960. Michael is fourth from the right in the back row. His obituary was printed in the Stamford Mercury, dated 26 February 2021.

#### Alan Field (OS 50)

Alan sadly passed away in November 2020. He was at Stamford School for eight years. He was in Town House which he served as a House Prefect and Music Official in the 1949-50 academic year. Alan was Company Quartermaster Sergeant for the CCF Army Section. During the same year, he played David in the School adaptation of the Rivals. He "played his part with distinction achieving broad comedy without descending into farce." Alan also earned a School Certificate in English Language and Drawing.

#### **Graham Robinson (OS 65)**

We have recently been advised of the passing of Graham Robinson who passed away last July in Brazil where he had made his home some years ago. A full tribute will appear in a future Update. Graham was an enthusiastic Mini-Cooper owner and founder member and previous Chairman of the Mini Cooper Register, and there was a notice on the website in July last year.

#### Chris Acum (OS 70)

The OS Club have been notified of the death of Chris Acum (1963-70).

Chris passed away peacefully on 6th February 2021 after bravely battling cancer, aged 69 years. He was husband of Linda, father of Jody & Gregg, grandad of Cleo, brother to Gill and Alison and great friend to many. Donations are being raised in memory of Chris, payable to LOROS c/o G. Chris lived near Leicester for many years and made a successful career in textiles.

#### Ted Stevenson (OS 70) writes:

Gentlemen, It is with great sadness that I have to inform you that our old friend, Chris Acum, passed away on February 6th. He had been battling bravely with cancer for a year.

Chris was a great guy. He and I were born only a day apart and we had many other things in common. We both represented various sporting teams at the school from the early days of junior football - he was a very good centre forward with a great ability for heading the ball - right through to the first teams at hockey and cricket when we were in the 6th form. Chris went on to play at a high standard in hockey in his adult life.

We also learnt to play bridge together and I clearly remember the two of us turning up - uninvited, yes, but nobody told us otherwise - at the Stamford Bridge Club one Wednesday evening only to be met at the door by a none-too-pleased Bruce McKenzie with the words 'what are you doing here??' Bruce had a fairly high position at the club and I don't think that either Chris's or my abilities were quite in keeping with what he would expect from anyone who may otherwise be there from the School!

What many of you may not be aware of is that Chris also excelled in a game that is peculiar only to the Stamford area: Push Penny. Not to be confused with

Shove Ha'penny, Push Penny was played widely in pubs in the Stamford area during the '70s but it would appear that it is now rarely seen. Maybe one of our old pals who are still in the Stamford area could update on this?

One final memory I would like to share with you about Chris. I was a regular visitor to Corfu during the '70s during my student and early teaching days. Although Greece, under the currency of the Drachma, was a fairly cheap place to spend 5 or 6 weeks in the summer, there were certain delicacies that were unavailable. In the year in question, Chris had succumbed to my

ranting about what a great place it was to relax in excess sun, sand and sea surroundings and came out to join me for the last half of my stay. As he unpacked his rucksack on arrival he passed me something that I had jokingly referred to before I had left with the words 'here's the jar of Branston Pickle you told me you are always craving for!'

He will be greatly missed.

So sorry to hear such sad news. Chris was one of the first friends I made at Junior School and being in the same "House" we enjoyed many a game of football, rugby, hockey and cricket together, though he was always a bit more athletic and nimble than me. Meeting up in the pub (Stamford or Empingham) ahead of going to parties in the late '60s, early '70s was another fond memory of a truly great guy. I always think of Chris when I'm passing Tickencote on the A1 and no doubt I'll continue to do so, though it will be even more poignant now.
