
#### OS Author

We are delighted that Peter MacKenzie (OS 74) has become the latest Old Stamfordian to publish a novel, 'The Needful', which is available for <u>purchase here</u>.


#### The blurb of the book:

All major cities in Africa have at least one international school and they are prominent in the lives of transient diplomats, other expatriates, and, increasingly, of the local middle classes. They throw up multiple challenges as different cultures interact, not always easily or willingly.

The International School of Ndwalowe, in the imaginary African country of Awanza, is just emerging from bankruptcy. Charged with this responsibility, indeed daunted by it, is Peter Corby, British, in his first headship and in Africa for the first time.



He must deal with recalcitrant teachers, unreasonable parents, intractable students, and a sometimes-frustrating Board of Directors in this affectionate tale often inspired by the author's own experiences.



Since leaving Stamford, Peter has spent more than half his life living and working overseas in Switzerland, Germany, Japan, India, Tanzania and Namibia. He has visited more than fifty international schools, worked in six, been the Head of three, and has sat on the Board of one. He has been a member of the Board of the Association of International Schools in Africa, was for three years the President of the Japan Council of International Schools, and has worked for the International Baccalaureate. 'The Needful' is his first novel.

### Mystery of OS Disappearance Solved After 80 Years

Windsor Webb (OS 39) attended Stamford School for two years before enlisting in the RAF reserve in June 1941. In 1942, he and seven other members of the 207 'Lancaster Bomber' Squadron disappeared but his second cousin, Mr Bill Webb, has now solved the mystery of what happened.

Since starting to research the disappearance in October 2021, that included a visit to the school to see the memorial in the Chapel, Bill has discovered that the plane was shot down on 25 November 1942, 40 miles from Bergan ann Zee, off the coast of the Netherlands.

### FAREWELLS

#### Norman Hazeldine (OS 52)

Norman's son, Richard (OS 83), has informed us that Norman sadly passed away on 24 February 2022.

#### He wrote the following:

Norman loved his time at Stamford which coincided with arrival of a new art teacher, Walter Douglas. Art was still being taught in a dilapidated wooden shed, a left over from WW1. Four students were enlisted to renovate the 'Shack', as it was to become known, and were sent to collect cow dung from the meadows to mix with lime, creating a render which they duly applied. There followed lessons in carpentry, cementing and decorating, all learned from local craftsmen, using recycled material. The master's old car was also used to teach basic mechanics and coachwork, including sign writing. Norman would recall how, although many of the methods and approaches appeared eccentric, they achieved results and the lessons learnt on how to tackle projects stayed with him for life.

Norman was a school prefect and Head of Ancaster House. When he applied to Emmanuel College Cambridge to read Natural Sciences he had an interview with Mr Welbourne, Master of the College. The interview did not go to plan as Mr Welbourne could not offer a place, he did however comment on the outstanding piece of work he had received as a reference from his referee, W Douglas, the likes of which prose he had never read before and asked permission if it could be retained for the college archives.

After School Norman completed his National Service in the RAF, before reading Natural Sciences at Fitzwilliam College Cambridge. He then started work at British Sugar, then Unilever before joining Walkers Crisps in 1967. He retired as Technical Director in 1993 having overseen the growth of the company from a family run business to part of an international food giant.

Norman retained his association with the school, both his sons Richard (OS 83) and Thomas (OS 87) like their father were school prefects and Heads of Ancaster. His daughter Jane attended the High School. Norman was a keen member of the Old Stamfordian Club and served on the committee and as Chairman.

He leaves a widow Catherine, three children and six grandchildren.
