RULES

UPDATING OF THE CLUB RULES

Background

The Committee of the Old Stamfordian Club (OSC) recently initiated an updating of the Club Rules which have not been reviewed for many years. The objective is to ensure that the Rules accurately reflect the mission of the OSC to serve all its members and the developing partnership between the OSC and the Stamford Endowed Schools (SES).

In this regard two key changes have taken place that impact on the OSC:

• Will Phelan, Principal of Stamford Endowed Schools, has described his vision of the Stamford Community as consisting of the Stamford schools, the Old Stamfordian Club, the Old Girls' Guild, parents of students and alumni and local institutions. On the basis that so much more can be achieved by co-operation and collaboration, the OSC is committed to playing its full part in the Stamford Community as it develops.

• The level of activity within the OSC has increased substantially as the Club seeks to provide a programme of events and initiatives which appeals to all generations. To ensure an appropriate level of professionalism in how the OSC operates, a close collaborative partnership is now in place between the Club and the SES Development Office.

Specifics of the updating of the Rules:

Rule 2 underlines the commitment of OSC to play a full part in the Stamford Community.

Rule 3 deals with Membership. Membership is no longer associated with the payment of a fee. Membership is therefore available to all former students of Stamford School, provided that the criteria in clause 3.1 are met. Nevertheless, it is important that the Committee retains over-riding responsibility for the management of the OSC, including addressing actions of individual members which may bring the Club into disrepute. For many years the Rules contained provision for expulsion and it is proposed to re-introduce this in clause 3.6.

Rule 4 contains a provision that the Chairman of the Reunion Organising Sub Committee should be an Officer of the Club to reflect the importance of our flagship event.

Rule 5 contains provision for attendance at Committee Meetings via electronic means at the Chairman's discretion. Improvements in IT technology have enabled 'virtual meetings' to be very effective and to save on travelling time.

Rule 6 in addition to members being able to exercise control by participation in the AGM, there is now a provision whereby control can be exercised via an EGM (6.2). The expression Independent Examiner

features in clause 6.1 for the first time simply to reflect current practice.

Rule 7 reflects the fact that the activities of the OSC are now mainly funded through an annual budget agreed between the OSC and the SES Development Office. This relationship is governed by a Collaboration Agreement including service level criteria which are to be reviewed regularly.

Rule 9 although a remote prospect, best practice dictates that a mechanism is prescribed in the Rules in the event that the OSC has to be dissolved.

Conclusion

The existing Rules need updating to ensure they are fit for purpose and to provide a framework that allows the OSC to meet its goals and objectives.

FAREWELLS

John Kendrick Sutcliffe (OS 56)

John's wife, Annette Sutcliffe (OS 58), has informed us that John sadly passed away on 1 February 2021.

Annette writes:

Sadly I have to report that John Kendrick Sutcliffe - OS 1946 to 1956 died on 1st February 2022. John, who lived in Peterborough, was a day boy in the junior school until he was 13, when he transferred to being a boarder. After A levels, he won a scholarship to Fitzwilliam House, Cambridge, from where he graduated in Natural Sciences in 1959. He embarked on a career in teaching, principally Physics, at Repton School, near Derby. After six years he was appointed Head of Science at the Harvey Grammar School, Folkestone, Kent, where he introduced the teaching of Nuffield Physics. He remained at the Harvey until retirement. Out of school he was an active member of St. George's

Church, Folkestone, where he served as a Church Warden for 13 years following retirement from teaching. We were married in 1963 and had two children, two grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.



Our Archivist writes:

John Kendrick Sutcliffe joined Stamford School in 1945. He started in Country House and then moved over to Browne House where he became a House Prefect and Captain of the Cross-Country Team (as shown in the team picture). For his final year, John served as a School Prefect and Head of Browne House. John was also a Lance-Corporal and Assistant Instructor Signals in the Army Section of the CCF. In 1953, he appeared in the School Play, Coriolanus, in which he played an Aedile (a Roman Magistrate) and a Volscian Senator.

When he left Stamford School in 1956, John was accepted as a Commoner at Fitzwilliam House, Cambridge where he read Natural Sciences. In 1963, he wrote to the Old

Stamfordian Club. By this time, he was teaching Physics at Repton, and said he was 'enjoying being a "Squibs" (a reference to C.A.M. 'Squibs' Bowman who was Physics Master at Stamford School during John's schooldays).
