Fundraising Swim Across Lake Geneva

Paul Grindal (OS 87) has been part of a team who took part in a 70km relay of Lake Geneva. He told us:

"Over the 5/6th of September I was a member of a 5 man swim team (The Broker Buoys) who took part in a swim a relay race, the entire 70km, length of Lake Geneva, (without wetsuits). It was part of a three, property-related, team race, taking on the challenge which had only been completed by 12 other teams previously, those teams being the few that had met the Lake Geneva Swimming Association rules."



"Apart from the need to beat our fellow teams, most importantly, the event was in aid of supporting 4 charities (to whom the swimmers all had a variety of personal connections):

- Charlie Waller Memorial Trust (mental health focused)
- **Muscular Dystrophy UK** (helping those with muscle wasting disease)
- MacMillan (our only large charity but close to many of us)
- **FirstTouch** (care for sick and premature babies at St George's Hospital, SW London)

Our current fund raising stands at almost £110,000 and is still rising.

We departed from Chateau de Chillon at 8am on Monday 5 September, reaching Geneva just under 27 hours later on Tuesday 6. In fact, my team won the race in 26hrs 58mins, with the Ladies of the Lake team a mere 5 minutes later – quite amazing when you consider the distance we had covered."

Geoff Holyoake (OS 74) himself was unfortunately unable to play and join in on the day due to Covid.


The 2023 Spring meeting is planned for Saturday 6 May 2023 at Luffenham Heath

The Stamford Lecture Series

Former architect of the Eden Project, Michael Pawlyn, will be giving the next Stamford Lecture on Thursday 7 November and we are delighted that he will be joining the School for a virtual lecture. Treating nature as a blueprint, he believes there are huge gains to be made by learning from how the natural world works.

In this talk, Michael will give his perspective on the key differences between conventional sustainability and the emerging paradigm of regenerative design. He will describe how biomimicry – learning design lessons from the living world – will be a crucial part of this transformation. The talk will be illustrated with projects which explain how this thinking can be applied in a practical way.



The lecture will be held virtually on Zoom on Thursday 17 November at 7pm.

FAREWELLS

We have been informed of the passing of two members of our Old Stamfordian community and we extend our condolences to their families and friends.

Alan (Eric) Twelvetree (OS 45)

Alan's daughter, Anne Rogers, informed us of the sudden passing of her father in February this year. Anne writes:

"Alan and his brother John were evacuated from Great Yarmouth in 1941 to stay with an uncle farming in Barrowden and were pupils at the school in Country House until 1945.

Alan's time at Stamford had a great influence on his life and he clearly enjoyed his time there, frequently regaling the family with tales of school life. He passed a good school certificate and left the school determined to make something of himself. Sadly, returning to a heavily damaged Great Yarmouth after the war, life and schooling was badly disrupted. So Alan left at 17 for a job in the Borough Treasurer's Office, set to and studied at night for his CIPFA qualifications. He and Pat, whom he married in 1953, moved around the length and breadth of the country as Alan worked his way up through the ranks in local government to become County Treasurer of Essex aged 46, a position he held until retirement. He served as president of the Society of County Treasurers, was presented to HM Queen Elizabeth II and was awarded the Freedom of the City of London in 1987.

In retirement Alan continued to be extremely active, training full time to become a very accomplished silversmith. He helped out with local organisations and also enjoyed watercolour painting, needlepoint, collecting antiques, and local history. He was blessed with very good health throughout his life and had begun a new painting on the afternoon before he died!

We all came to visit Stamford last year and he walked us along the prescribed

route to the school from the station along the alleyways; anything else was out of bounds! We met some current pupils who seemed astounded to see an old boy from the time of WWII still walking happily around the town!"

Dudley Bryant MBE (OS 61) shared the news of Bob's passing with us, as Bob was a regular attendee at the Boston Lunch, along with his wife, Barbara.

The funeral service was held on Monday 24 October 2022 at St. Mary's and St. Nicholas' Church, Boston.


