You may have seen our weekly sporting round-ups that are published on Old Stamfordian social media each Thursday. Following feedback we will be including a monthly summary of sport within this mailing going forward.

It has been a successful term, not just month, with victories and impressive performances across a wide range of sports. The U16s rugby 7s won the LeicsGS 16s trophy at the beginning of the month, and this was swiftly followed by some fantastic performances, including personal bests, for our swimmers at the Olympic Park in London. The U11 fencers from the Junior School won bronze at the British School Fencing Team Championships, only missing out on silver by three points.

As the month went on there were massive performances by our rugby 7s 1st team (first picture below) in the Sedburgh Super 10s. The tournament is the Grand Finale of the schools rugby season, held in the picturesque surroundings of the Yorkshire Dales. Stamford went through the qualified for the latter stages of the tournament, only to be knocked out by the hosts and eventual runners-up Sedburgh.

The Schools welcomed Waseda Jitsugyo High School from Tokyo earlier this week, celebrating our schools' continuing relationship with the international school that sends students to study with us each year. Two great rugby games were also played, with the opening try of the day going to Stamford (bottom picture).

Elsewhere, the football 1st XI, in their first season since football returned as a competitive sport, won the ISFA Mercian League (third picture).

There has also been lots of inter-house sport, as well as external fixtures. On Wednesday 29 March, the swimming Lower School House Championships took place in the Memorial Pool, with Radcliffe coming out victorious overall (second picture). It was a far cry from the days of the outdoor swimming pool, which we are sure many of you will remember with varying degrees of fondness! The sporting week, month and indeed term ended with the Burghley Run. The annual cross country race is now run by all year groups from across the three schools, alongside members of staff (fourth picture).

On Monday 20 March we welcomed five Old Stamfordians back to the Schools, as well as two members from the wider Stamford community, to talk to our students about careers in the legal sector.

The speakers were invited to share their insights into the legal world and ranged from solicitors to barristers, including those starting their training to those at the end of their career. FAREWELLS

John Troth (OS 57)

John's brother-in-law, Richard Palmer (OS 71), informed us of John's passing. Our thoughts and condolences are with John's family and friends. Richard writes:

John was born in Stamford and attended Stamford School until 1957. On leaving school he joined the local brick and tile manufacturer, Williamson Cliff, and after a time learning the ropes, was sponsored to study clay technology at Stoke-on-Trent. This was where John found his vocation, progressing through the managerial ranks of the industry initially in Kent and then on to Westbrick in Exeter.

His career watershed came when the family uprooted and moved to North Wales on his appointment as Managing Director of Dennis Ruabon, quarry tile manufacturer, near Wrexham. Here, he carried out an extensive modernisation and expansion programme, which saw the factory transformed into one of the leading producers and exporters of quarry tiles in the UK. John travelled widely throughout the world, developing and promoting his company's products and obtaining new export markets, for which he was awarded an OBE in 1991 for services to export.

He was also a keen advocate of training and development and became Chairman of North East Wales Training and Enterprise Council, where he championed the national development of modern apprenticeships and the NVQ programme. He also worked with North East Wales Institute of Higher Education (NEWI) to gain university status for Wrexham Glyndwr University, where he was awarded an honorary degree for his work

In his retirement, he continued his voluntary work becoming Chairman of Groundwork North Wales supporting communities in need. He was particularly proud of forming a group to acquire the local Marford Quarry, developed as a nature reserve, where he and his wife, Judy, spent many happy walks, finding this particularly rewarding during those desolate days of lockdown.

John was a keen rugby player, playing for Stamford Town in his day and latterly as the muscles ached more, for several "vet's" teams in Wales, before settling down as an ardent rugby supporter. And as he said, it was always a difficult one when England met Wales in the Six Nations and he was watching the match in his local. Travel was also a big part of family life with many annual trips through Europe in Daisy, the family VW camper van, and latterly flying off to visit daughter, Jen and family, in South Africa.

John led a full and interesting career. But we, as family, will remember him as the loving family man with a great sense of humour. Trips up to Wales were always a time of great celebration when the extended family gathered together in the warm hospitality of the Troth household. Always proud to be a Stamfordian, he is survived by his devoted wife of 57 years, Judy, whom he met at the Methodist Youth group at Barn Hill, and who attended Stamford High School until 1963, plus his three daughters, Sue, Jen, and Liz, and eight grandchildren.
