Above all the lunch is a fun event as the photographs below show, so don't just save the date - <u>book now!</u> we look forward to seeing you there.












OSC Newsletter 2022/23

FAREWELLS

Richard Lewis (OS 51)

Richard's son, Piers, informed us that his father passed away on 30 March 2023. Piers writes:

Richard Hunter Lewis was born and brought up in Stamford, and from the educational certificates, he achieved his school certificates in July 1948 (I can find evidence of English Language, English Literature, Scripture, History, French, General Science, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry). His uncle was 'Squibs' Bowman, Physics Master at the school, and he played a lot of rugby and hockey.

From school he left to join the RAF, and on commission (initial training in Jurby, Isle of Man) ended up training as a Bombing Navigator (in Winnipeg, Canada) and served in many RAF Squadrons, including the infamous 617 Squadron as well as 149 Squadron. He flew in Vulcans and Canberras. He was on standby for a number of months on the former of those aircraft type during the height of the cold war with a 'special' payload strapped to the aircraft whilst based in Germany. He also spent a lot of time horse riding and water skiing in his spare time.

After 12 years, he left the RAF as a Flight Lieutenant and relocated to Maidstone, Kent where he joined a defence company (Elliot Brothers, later to become GEC Marconi Avionics) as a Project Lead on a number of key projects including the stores management system on the Tornado, various systems on the C5 Galaxy as well as systems on the VC10, BAC 111 and even Concorde. In the late sixties, he bought a run-down 16th Century hall house and took a year to completely

renovate it. He married Vikki in 1973, raised two children at that same house, and Vikki still lives there today. Towards the end of his career, he moved into business development before retiring in 1997. Since then, he spent most of his time restoring classic cars.

He died eventually from a reoccurrence of Lymphoma which was untreatable, in Maidstone. His wife remains in Maidstone, his son lives in Hampshire and his daughter in Essex. His brother still lives in Stamford today.


David Cooper (OS 64)

Don Bentley (OS 63 & former member of staff) informed us of David's passing. He provided an obituary that was included in the Glenside News, the magazine produced for Careby, Castle Bytham and the surrounding villages, a copy of which is below. Much-loved David Cooper passed away aged 76 on January 2nd 2023 at his new home in Norfolk with his wife Barbara and daughter Louise by his side following a brief brave fight with cancer.

Dave was born on 9th July 1946 in Stamford and was a Stamford School pupil and keen rugby player. Whilst still at school he met his future wife Barbara and following teacher training courses they married in 1968.

Dave graduated from De La Salle College in Manchester and taught at various local schools until, after a brief spell managing a garage in Grantham, he began a long-standing career with British Rail, becoming the Main Line's Maintenance Manager until retiring in 2004 after 30 years of service.

After relocating with Barbara and Louise to Careby in 1977, Dave became known as someone always willing to help anyone. His passion was for engines, building and renovations, extending and improving Maazledene, refitting the family's narrowboat and more recently, rebuilding and leaving as a legacy, the long-closed and hugely derelict Careby Village Hall.
