The PhVWP-V is composed of European experts from all 27 EU countries selected according to their specific expertise and provides guidance and advice on the coordination and supervision of the pharmacovigilance of veterinary medicinal products within the EU.

James brings 13 years of experience, having worked in various roles, including laboratory animal veterinarian and veterinary pathologist in Sweden. His remarkable journey includes research on red deer antler growth and recent publications on veterinary and medical adverse events.
